Monday 18 November- Friday 22 November	K1-K2 (in 2025)	Space	Best Dressed Aliens
<p>Develop a growth mindset and emotional intelligence skills as we learn how aliens respond to feedback in space. Learners will grow their vocabulary for describing their feelings and experiences as well as learn how to be kind to one another. Exciting learning experiences in the classroom, including science experiments, craft, interactive games and role plays, will lead to progress in their reading, writing speaking and listening skills. Watch as their confidence and curiosity grow immersed in this exciting new world!</p>			
Monday 25 November- Friday 29 November	K1-K2 (in 2025)	Space	Travelling Back to Earth
<p>Imagination is the only limitation as we travel through space this week. Children will learn about the planets they pass by and the wonders of the solar system. They will develop their vocabulary for describing characters, settings and textures, whilst building their speaking confidence. A range of differentiated activities will support the learners in improving their speaking, listening, reading and writing skills, whilst expanding their knowledge of and fascination with the universe!</p>			
Monday 2 December- Friday 6 December	K1-K2 (in 2025)	Snow and Ice	Cosy glow in the snow
<p>Discover the secret world of animals searching for a cosy home in the snow. Learn rich and vivid vocabulary for describing movement and setting to the beautiful backdrop of a cosy home in the snow. Learners will improve their command of English through a variety of tasks, games and activities designed to pique their interest. Activities leading to English literacy improvement will include drama, craft, speaking games, sequencing and riddles. By tapping into the learners' innate joy of learning and exploring, they can make fantastic progress with their speaking, listening, reading and writing skills this week.</p>

Explore a world of snow and ice on this exciting Early Years course. Each day your child will explore a different aspect of our coldest environments and the incredible animals who live there.
